

## **Some general information on Fringe:**

Fringe Intelligence offers not yet established intelligence news and intelligence articles next to mainstream, while Fringe Spitting provides news and tools for investigative journalists and researchers. Fringe is Dutch-based, both journals are free of charge and biweeklies.

Every issue of Fringe Intelligence contains sixty or more articles ranging from intelligence and counterintelligence, via criminal intelligence and counter terrorism to jihadism, parapolitics and other topics with intelligence aspects. Almost all articles are internet downloads. The quality is the quality of the source.

In Fringe Spitting lots of tips and tools, lots of links, freedom of information [foi] news, partly intelligence related and in almost every issue an own article on foi [a.o. on the Dutch foia: Wob].

All articles circulate in the source-language: 90% English. About 10% of the content is about or related to The Netherlands. In 2007 we will launch a site with among others all ever in Fringe published articles [10,000+] in an own searchable database.

Fringe has 1,000+ subscribers: 45% intelligence watchers and analysts, 35% press, 10% foi specialists. Of all subscribers 40% are non-Dutch, living in 40 countries; 10% of the subscribers are employees of government bodies [40% of them of intelligence and counter terrorism agencies] and 10% of universities.

The editors, both independent intelligence analysts and -researchers, are

assisted by a small network of, Dutch and foreign, correspondents. In the journals our selection of articles from a whole range of specialist

sites and 250+ newspapers/magazines. Some of the more specialised
